Why did I receive a notice?

Does the Board of Determination decide what work gets done?

No, the board of determination decides necessity, but action in circuit court within 10 days. MCL280.72a. does not determine the scope or cost of the project. Further, the board of determination does not determine how much property owners and municipalities will be assessed.

Does the decision of the Board of Determination have to be unanimous?
