
Summerlin North Drain Informational Meeting



Summerlin North Drain - History

- Plat was constructed in 1993.
- System was an orphan drain it was never formally established as a county drain.
- Backyard flooding problems in 2019/2020 prompted Holland Charter Township to petition to Establish a Drainage District on June 3, 2020.
- Board of Determination on July 30, 2020 determined that the formal establishment of the Summerlin North Drain infrastructure as county drain was necessary.



Summerlin North Drain Engineering Design


- Cleanout the Summerlin North backyard detention area to match its 1993 grading.
- Cleanout the Quincy Street north ditch from Summerlin North to Quincy Park. This ditch is where Summerlin North drains into.










1994 Plat Record Drawing – West of Oasis




1994 Plat Record Drawing – East of Oasis

Summerlin North Drain – Construction and Timeline

- Project is out for permits.
- The EGLE Joint Permit Application for work in floodplain, wetlands, and streams is currently being reviewed.
 Expected timeline for receiving the EGLE permit is late summer.
- Construction to occur in late summer/early fall if permit(s) are received on time.
- The Contractor will remove all landscaping, fences, retaining walls, planter boxes, etc. from the easement area.
- Property owners will be responsible to reinstall their fence following construction.





Summerlin North Drain – Encroachment Agreements

- Property owners with sheds in the current easement will have to sign an encroachment agreement with OCWRC. If no agreement is signed, the sheds will be required to be removed by the property owner.
- Following construction, the property owner can reinstall their fence into the easement area with an encroachment agreement with OCWRC.
