

WHAT ARE YOUR RIGHTS?

Consumers of Community Mental Health (CMH) services are guaranteed rights by the Michigan Mental Health Code.

They include:

- » Development of an Individual Plan of Service using the person-centered planning process.
- » Confidentiality about your treatment and the information in your record.
- » Being treated with dignity and respect.
- » Being free from abuse and neglect.
- » The ability to provide informed consent to treatment provided and to withdraw consent at any time.
- » Having a choice in who provides your services.
- » The ability to file a rights complaint if you feel your rights have been violated.
- » Requesting access to your record.
