# Key Principles for Success of the Plan

1) Use existing PIHP/CMH system and staff who have experience and established relationships with people using services

2) The organizations/providers who help plan the care should also control the resources

3) Ensure that all services and providers currently available will be in the new plan

# Key Principles for Success of the Plan

4) Promote health homes for persons with chronic conditions



The plan anticipates it will be part of service delivery model.

5) Use local and regional Health Information Technology solutions to enhance coordinated care



This plan calls for supplemental incentive payments to achieve specific outcomes, which include integrating information technology with a focus on electronic medical records and sharing information between ICOs and PIHPs.

# Key Principles for Success of the Plan

6) The plan should align contractual requirements while ensuring the rights of people served.

a. Simplify and coordinate enrollment
