We are excited to announce that our skilled and caring hearing and vision teams are back in the schools this year, helping to ensure children can hear and see, and therefore learn their best. Regular and thorough screenings can prevent lost learning time in school, help avoid behavioral problems associated with decreased hearing or vision, and lets teachers and parents know when a child may need some medical intervention to help them see or hear optimally. Per the public health code:

Hearing screenings happen in: Kindergarten, 2nd & 4th grades

Vision screenings happen in: 1st, 3rd, 5th, & 7th grades & 9th (when starting to drive!)

Avoid Identity Theft—CSHCS will never ask you for your bank account information

In an ongoing effort to help you avoid identity theft, please be alerted that Children's Special Health Care Services (CSHCS) will never ask for your bank account information, checking account routing numbers or any such banking information.

If you are ever asked for that by someone saying they represent CSHCS, do not share your information and notify CSHCS or your local health department immediately.

You have received a "secure message" email from Irene Atwood"—what is this?

CSHCS takes your privacy seriously! Once a year, to verify your confidential information, we'll send you a secure email message from Irene Atwood, our program clerk for Ottawa County CSHCS.

Follow these steps for opening your secure message:

- 1. Click on the secure message in your email, and If prompted, click on the "looks safe" button in the banner.
- 2. Click or hover over the secure message attachment and click the download button, then click on the html attachment to open it.
- 3. If this is your first time opening a secure message from CSHCS, you'll need to create a password protected account with Cisco Secure Email Encryption Service following these steps:

First you'll see a pop-up box "Secure Email Encryption Service". Verify that your email address appears in the "To" and click "Register".

Then fill out the New User Registration form to create a password protected account with Cisco Secure Email Encryption Service. After filling out the form, check the agree box and hit Register.

To activate your new Cisco account, go to your email for a new message from Cisco—<u>donotreply@res.cisco.org</u>. Verify your email to activate your new Cisco account.

- 4. Return to your browser where you downloaded the secure message in step 2. **Click the Continue button** in the "Secure Email Encryption Service" pop-up box.
- 5. Enter your new Cisco password and click on "Open Online".
- 6. Review the information CSHCS has for you*.

*If your primary insurance has changed, CALL Irene Atwood, CSHCS Program Clerk, 616-393-4439. Sending insurance information via email may not keep your information safe and secure.

Note: MiHealth and Medicaid Health Plans (MHP) changes do not need to be reported—they're updated automatically in our system.

New Special Needs Car Seat Clinic Trinity Health



Traveling with a child who has disabilities or behavioral challenges can be daunting. Finding just the right car seat—which can be difficult for a child with positional challenges—just got easier for West Michigan families, thanks to the new Trinity Health Special Needs Car Seat Clinic in Muskegon.

Therapists and certified child passenger safety technicians assess current positioning needs—including a physical exam and complete medical history—and conduct fit tests to determine which car seat

best meets a child's needs. They work with durable equipment vendors on insurance approval and ordering of specialty car seats, and train families on how to install and use their new car seats properly.

A specialist's referral and an insurance authorization are required. Call to learn more or to schedule an appointment!

A message from Debbie Whitford, Michigan Alliance for Families Parent Mentor

Hello Ottawa County CSHCS Families,

I am Debbie Whitford, your Michigan Alliance for Families parent mentor in Ottawa County and beyond! As a parent of a child with a disability, our special education experiences inspired me to want to support other families and share the wonderful resources and information that are available (at no cost) through Michigan's Parent Training and Information Center, known as Michigan Alliance for Families. I've been helping families as a parent mentor for going on eight years.

Our goal at Michigan Alliance for Families is to educate and offer resources to families of children and youth with disabilities, mental health challenges, and those who've experienced trauma, to ensure that their babies, toddlers and children receive needed educational and developmental interventions. While not all children will require special education services, it is important that families know that there are resources available to help if needed.

Our website, <u>michiganallianceforfamilies.org</u>, is a wealth of information and resources—including many on-demand videos and live webinar events—to help you gather disability specific knowledge, and for learning about special education services, such as: Evaluation and Eligibility for Special Education; Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) and Individualized Family Service Plans (IFSPs), Transition to Adulthood, and more. Many of these resources are available in Spanish and Arabic too.

Often, parents of children with disabilities don't know where to....BEGIN. Whether you have a baby with developmental delays, a child newly diagnosed with a disability, a youth struggling in school, or a young adult learning to exercise self-determination, all that matters is that you...BEGIN. By seeking information and resources to help you on your journey, you'll build knowledge and confidence that will empower you to meet challenges and inspire success for your child.






MICHIGAN SUPPORTING AND INCLUDING **BROTHERS & SISTERS (MISIBS)**


