

# Community Mental Health of Ottawa County Report of Infectious Disease

The Community Mental Health of Ottawa County Infection Control Program encourages reporting of persons (staff or consumer) with an infection or virus that is considered contagious. The following are some examples of the type of infection/virus that should be reported to the Infection Control Coordinator:

Chickenpox	Conjunctivitis (pinkeye)	Head lice	Hepatitis (all types)
Pertussis	Impetigo	Influenza (flu)	Measles
Meningitis	Mumps	Ringworm	Roseola
Rubella	Scabies	Shingles	Strep throat
