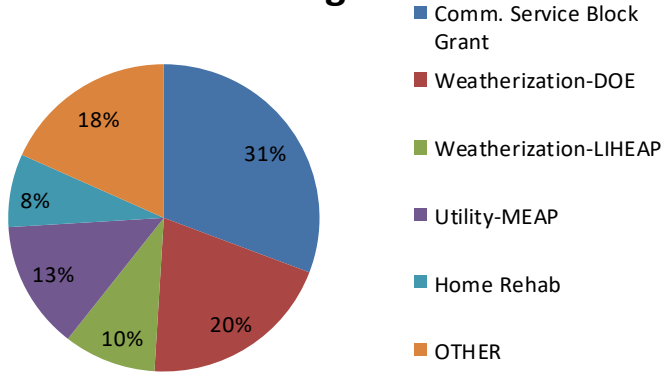


Ottawa County CAA exists to reduce the effects of poverty by promoting self sufficiency and economic independence.

Utility Assistance: assistance from various grants to pay past due utility bills.	386/521 households/assists: Average assistance of \$314
Housing-Weatherization: weatherize homes to conserve energy use.	35: 32 Owner Occupied
Food Assistance: food program for seniors	380 households/month (seniors)
Food Assistance: food program for general public.	831 Households/quarter
Migrant Services: emergency services for agricultural workers.	150 services/ 49 households
Tax Assistance: tax preparation for low-income, disabled, senior households	219 households: \$325,389 in refunds (\$1,485 average)
MI Enrolls-Medicaid: assistance enrolling in qualified health plan and for a primary care physician.	736 individuals paired with health plan and physician
