What is a Drainage District?

A drainage district is the land area that benefits from the drain. Determination is to receive evidence and hear If the Board of Determination finds the project testimony of interested persons and determine whether necessary, the Water Resources Commissioner will hold the petitioned activities are necessary and conducive to a public meeting to review apportionments after a project scope has been determined. Notices for the public hearing on assessments will be sent out at a later date.
