

MENTAL HEALTH MILLAGE

Program Outcomes FY 2022



3x MRS cash match agreement to pay for job developer and short-term follow along for consumers. This agreement will bring three times the dollar amount into Ottawa County.



Nine Clubhouse Scholarships were awarded this year. These scholarships go to those not receiving CMH services and allows them attend our Clubhouse Program, an organization that supports individuals with mental illness.



199 Ottawa County Jail inmates were **referred for psychiatric services** from medical providers to improve mental health and prevent recidivism upon release.



291 people have received program services through the **Pathways to Better Health** which provides vital treatment and services to those with two or more chronic health conditions.



426 individuals were served through the **Holland Drop-In Center**, a peer support center operated by adults with mental illness for adults with mental illness.



1,093 uninsured, under insured, or Medicaid Spend down individuals not eligible for CMHOC services were assisted by the **Community Navigation** staff to get connected to needed services in the community.

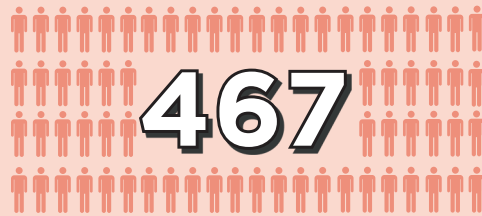

Through millage funding, in partnership with the Intermediate School District and multiple local school districts, the **Ottawa Community Schools Network (OCSN)** provided coordinated services and mental health treatment to **345** students in grades K-12.



158 people received help with the **Housing Assistance** program, which supports local residential providers by providing financial assistance to cover gaps in funding related to the staffing crisis and shortfalls in room and board expenses.



467 individuals were enrolled as members in our social and recreational programs for people with disabilities in Ottawa County.

Our evidence-based practice through **Senior Reach** provided mental health services to **102** seniors, allowing them to remain independent and in their homes.
