Children's Mobile Crisis

What is a Crisis?

- When individuals/families are unable to handle a situation and regular coping skills are not working
- When a youth has potential to hurt themselves or someone else, intentionally, or unintentionally
- When a youth requires immediate intervention to remain in the family home and avoid legal, medical, or other out-of-home placement

Who can use Children's Mobile Crisis?

Youth through the age of 20 who reside in Ottawa County and live in their family home (including foster care or a relative caregiver)- Children's Mobile Crisis provides the following Services:

- In-home mental health crisis intervention
- Family support and guidance in difficult situations related to mental health issues
- Strengths-based, needs-driven services
- Assistance in developing safety/crisis plans
- Referral to community resources
