Vision Services

Seniors EyeCare Program – eyecareamerica.org
Eye exams and up to one year of care at no out-of-pocket cost for any disease diagnosed during the initial exam. Must be 65 or older and have not seen an eye doctor in three or more years. Accepts Medicare and/or another insurance reimbursement as payment in full. Patients without insurance receive this care at no charge. Go online to see if you qualify.
