

Comparison of Suicide Rates from 1999-2018, All Ages





While the rate of death by suicide remains lower in Ottawa County than in the State of Michigan and the United States, data indicates that as of 2018, there was a significant increase in the annual number of suicides in Ottawa County over the past 30 years.

In 2018, there were 32 deaths by suicide among Ottawa County residents, the highest number in the last 20 years.

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

In 2018 the majority of deaths by suicide were among white men, people younger than 50 years of age, and residents that lived in the southwest quadrant of Ottawa County (south of Fillmore and west of 96th). Of concern, teenage suicides reached a 10-year high in 2018.

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Sex of Persons who Died by Suicide, 2010-2018




The vast majority of deaths by suicide (75%) among Ottawa County residents from 2010-2018 were among males, similar to national statistics. The variation among sexes is likely due to males selecting more lethal methods than females. Although more males *die* by suicide, in the United States both males and females report *suicidal ideation* at comparable rates*.

Over the last nine years, more deaths by suicide occurred in Ottawa County in May and October than any other months. Suicides among people of all ages tended to occur less frequently in the summer, and fewer suicides among Ottawa County residents occurred over the holiday season (December and January). Across the United States, the month with the *lowest* rate of suicide is December*.



Suicide fatalities among Ottawa County teens


Since 2008, the rate of suicide among youth under 20 has increased over 150% in Michigan. The rate of suicide among Ottawa County teens may also be increasing. Of particular concern are suicides occurring at younger ages than previously seen. In 2018, 4 of 6 teens who died by suicide were 16 years old and younger, a phenomenon that started in 2014 and has continued into 2018.

The percentage of suicides under age 20 has also been increasing. Six of thirty-two (19%) suicide fatalities in 2018 were among Ottawa County youth ages 13-19 years. This is higher than would be expected for a given year. From 2008 to 2017, on average, only 9% of all suicides in a year occurred in that age group. Since 2010, boys account for 58% of teen suicides and 50% of teen suicides have occurred in the SW quadrant of Ottawa County (south of Fillmore and west of 96th).

Method of teen suicides, 2010 to 2018

Ottawa County Suicide Prevention Coalition

Because the overall rate of death by suicide has been increasing in Ottawa County, community partners have come together and organized the **Ottawa County Suicide Prevention Coalition**. The Coalition's mission is to decrease the number of suicides and the stigma associated with mental health in Ottawa County by educating the community about warning signs and prevention strategies, promoting existing suicide prevention and mental health resources, and identifying and addressing emerging issues regarding suicide and suicide prevention.

Here are some of the Coalition's activities to date:

- Implemented Blue Envelope team response pilot program with Ottawa County schools.
- Facilitated a follow-up program between Ottawa County Victim's Advocates and local organizations to ensure families suffering tragic loss have access to resources.
- Created suicide fatality review team.
- Supported the implementation of be nice. action plans in Ottawa County.
- Supported QPR (Question, Persuade, Refer) trainings.
- Educated over 95 healthcare providers on suicide prevention (from multiple health systems).

Appendix A. Technical Notes

Overall Report

• In 2018, new data sources were utilized. Thus, information herein may differ from previous reports. Also, data in future iterations may vary slightly as case counts are updated and surveillance methods are refined.

Page 2

- Ottawa County death by suicide trend was assessed from 1990-2018 using Poisson regression with annual population offset to accommodate for population changes. Ottawa County data from 1990-1998 was obtained from the Ottawa County Medical Examiner. Year is associated with a positive increase in the annual number of suicides (p=0.001). Using the same methods, but limiting to 1999-2018, Year remained significantly associated with an annual increase in the number of suicides (p=0.006).
- Eighteen of the past 30 years had <20 deaths by suicide reported per year among Ottawa County residents, which may reduce the reliability of calculated rates and trend analyses.
