

# Who does what?

Lead screening, testing and treatment for Ottawa County children.

## Families

- Get children tested.
- Complete follow up testing.
- Work with health care providers for healthy children and home.
- Know what your child's blood lead test means (see chart).



## Providers

- Screen children ages 1-6 to determine lead exposure risks.
- Test blood lead levels in children ages 1-6.
- Provide lead safety and nutrition education.
- Follow up and retest (if needed).

## Ottawa County Department of Public Health

- Monitor blood lead level test results from the state.
- Follow up with providers (verify venous lead tests were ordered for children with capillary blood lead levels  $\geq 5$   $\mu\text{g}/\text{dl}$ ).
- Provide in-home nursing support to children with venous blood lead levels  $\geq 5$   $\mu\text{g}/\text{dl}$ .
  - Assess child's health status, development and nutrition.
  - Evaluate lead exposure risks in home.
  - Provide education and refer to resources.
