1. Presentation: Family to Family Program – A power point presentation was presented by Loren Snippe and Nathan Bishop.

- 2. H.R. 5698 Mrs. Kortman asked that H.R. 5698 Loss of Federal Entitlement Benefits for Eligible Medicaid and Medicare Eligible Prisoners be placed on the agenda. More information will be gathered and be brought back to the next Health and Human Services Committee meeting.
- 3. Presentation: Early On Program Diane Boeve, Community Health Nurse, explained that the Early On Program is a federally mandated program. The program helps children before the age of 3. Diane goes into the home and does a developmental assessment and then trains parents how to help the children. Referrals come through neo-natal units, parents, doctors, and foster care. The program is a collaboration

with funding from the federal government to ISD and than contracted with the health department.

- 4. Update Wrap Around Program An update of the Wrap Around Program was presented by Cora Visscher. 22 cases were referred to Wrap Around in 2007 and 20 cases were accepted for services.
- 5. Update: Human Services Coordinating Council A Human Services Coordinating Council update was presented by Lisa Stefanovsky.

MI Works!/CAA – Bill Raymond reported 620 tax returns were completed this year which helped a lot of families with the stimulus program.
