

Important Information for Hunting at Ottawa County Parks & Open Space Lands

- All hunters must follow all Michigan hunting regulations as set forth by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources.
- Hunting is not allowed within 30 yards of a property line. Property lines are marked with red plastic signs that are 4 inches wide and about 3 feet tall.
- Tree stands and type 1 ground blinds may be used per state laws. Nails, screws, bolts, or like products that would penetrate tree bark are not allowed. All stands or blinds must have identification attached.
- Gathering of dead materials found on the ground to construct or camouflage blinds is not allowed.
- Trapping is not allowed on any property managed by the Ottawa County Parks & Recreation Commission.
- Target practice or paint ball shooting is not allowed on any property managed by the Ottawa County Parks & Recreation Commission.
- Hunting is not allowed within 450 feet of any occupied building.
- Motorized vehicles are not allowed, except in designated parking areas.
- Cutting of trees or branches to create shooting lanes is not allowed.
- The use of bait to attract deer is not allowed.
- Fishing is allowed at designated properties following Michigan Department of Natural Resources laws.

Special Permit Required:

<u>Crockery Creek Natural Area</u>, <u>Upper Macatawa Natural Area</u> and the main (south of the creek) portion of <u>Stearns Creek Park</u> <u>South</u> allow only archery deer hunting by special permit via a lottery.

<u>Stearns Creek Park North (</u>AKA Helstrom Family Natural Area) allow archery and firearm hunting in accordance with the laws of the Michigan DNR during limited days/times by special permit via a lottery.

<u>Crockery Creek Natural Area</u> allows float in only waterfowl hunting by special permit.

<u>North Ottawa Dunes</u> and <u>Ottawa Sands</u> allow only firearm deer hunting by special permit via a lottery. Hunters who receive a special permit must agree to all hunting rules included with the permit, as well as follow Ottawa County Parks & Recreation rules and regulations.

<u>Successful applicants</u> are required to pay a non-refundable permit fee and may be required to attend a pre-hunt meeting. Hunters must also complete a post-hunt survey. Visit miOttawa.org/parks for instructions on applying.

Archery Deer Hunting Only:

These properties are open to archery deer hunting only and *do not require* a special parks permit.

No game other than deer may be taken.

All hunters must follow the Ottawa County Parks & Recreation Commission Open Space Land Rules and Regulations.

Open to Hunting per DNR Laws:

These properties are open to archery and firearm hunting in accordance with the laws of the Michigan DNR.

A special permit is *not required* to hunt in these properties. All hunters must follow the Ottawa County Parks & Recreation Commission Open Space Land Rules and Regulations.
