<p>State</p> <p>State of Michigan Proposal 18-1</p> <p>A proposed initiated law to authorize and legalize possession, use and cultivation of marijuana products by individuals who are at least 21 years of age and older, and commercial sales of marijuana through state-licensed retailers</p> <p>This proposal would: * Allow individuals 21 and older to purchase, possess and use marijuana and marijuana-infused edibles, and grow up to 12 marijuana plants for personal consumption. * Impose a 10-ounce limit for marijuana kept at residences and require amounts over 2.5 ounces be secured in locked containers. * Create a state licensing system for marijuana businesses and allow municipalities to ban or restrict them. * Permit retail sales of marijuana and edibles subject to a 10% tax, dedicated to implementation costs, clinical trials, schools, roads, and municipalities where marijuana businesses are located. * Change several current violations from crimes to civil infractions.</p> <p>Should this proposal be adopted?</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Yes <input type="checkbox"/> No</p>
<p>State of Michigan Proposal 18-2</p> <p>A proposed constitutional amendment to establish a commission of citizens with exclusive authority to adopt district boundaries for the Michigan Senate, Michigan House of Representatives and U.S. Congress, every 10 years</p> <p>This proposed constitutional amendment would: * Create a commission of 13 registered voters randomly selected by the Secretary of State: * 4 each who self-identify as affiliated with the 2 major political parties; and * 5 who self-identify as unaffiliated with major political parties. * Prohibit partisan officeholders and candidates, their employees, certain relatives, and lobbyists from serving as commissioners. * Establish new redistricting criteria including geographically compact and contiguous districts of equal population, reflecting Michigan's diverse population and communities of interest. <p>Ottawa Area Intermediate School District Regional Enhancement Millage Proposal</p> <p>Pursuant to state law, the revenue raised by the proposed millage will be collected by the intermediate school district and distributed to the constituent districts based on pupil membership count.</p> <p>Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Ottawa Area Intermediate School District, Michigan, be increased by 0.9 mill (\$0.9 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 10 years, 2019 to 2028, inclusive, to provide operating funds to enhance other state and local funding for local school district operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the intermediate school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2019 is approximately \$11,200,000, which funds will be disbursed as required by statute to: Allendale Public Schools, Coopersville Area Public Schools, Grand Haven Area Public Schools, Hamilton Community Schools, School District of the City of Holland, Hudsonville Public Schools, Jenison Public Schools, Saugatuck Public Schools, Spring Lake Public Schools, West Ottawa Public Schools, Zeeland Public Schools, Black River Public School, Eagle Crest Charter Academy, ICademy Global, Innocademy, Vanderbilt Charter Academy, Walden Green Montessori, West Michigan Academy of Arts and Academics, and Ottawa Area Intermediate School District?</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> Yes <input type="checkbox"/> No</p>
